# CRICKETER OF THE YEAR

**ETHAN BALL IS THE CARINGBAH SPORTS CRICKET CLUB CRICKETER OF THE YEAR FOR THE 2024/25 SEASON. ETHAN JOINED THE CLUB 4 YEARS AGO AND DURING THAT TIME HAS SCORED 2096 RUNS AT AN AVERAGE OF 44.6 WITH A TOP SCORE OF 116 INCLUDING 14 HALF-CENTURIES AND TAKEN A TOTAL OF 48 WICKETS AT AN AVERAGE OF 19.77 WITH HIS BEST BOWLING BEING 4-12. ETHAN HAS ALSO TAKEN 30 CATCHES FOR THE CLUB.**

Ethan has had a varied experience throughout the course of his junior cricket, having represented three different cricket associations at representative level most recently representing the Sutherland Shire Junior Cricket Association in the Watson Shield. Ethan first joined Caringbah Sports as a solid middle order batter. It wasn't long before an opportunity arose for him to open the batting and for the last three seasons, Ethan has scored most of his runs at the top of the order.

In the 2024/25 Ethan had an outstanding season, finishing the leading run scorer in the 16A competition scoring 702 runs at an average of 58.5. Although Ethan bats left-handed, he bowls right-handed, taking 17 wickets in 2024/25 at an average of 16.0. Ethan was also sharp in the field taking seven catches and executing several runouts.

Most importantly, Ethan plays the game in the right spirit. Ethan is passionate about his cricket, and has been a positive influence in all the teams he has played in. This year he took on the captaincy of our 16A team. The team battled an unusually high number of injuries which often meant we were short on players. Despite this, Ethan stepped up and took on extra responsibility, working hard to encourage his teammates and showing great maturity as a leader.

Congratulations Ethan, you have worked really hard this season and are a deserved winner of the cricketer of the year award for 2024/25. Thanks for your contribution to our club and we wish you every success in your future years as a senior cricketer.

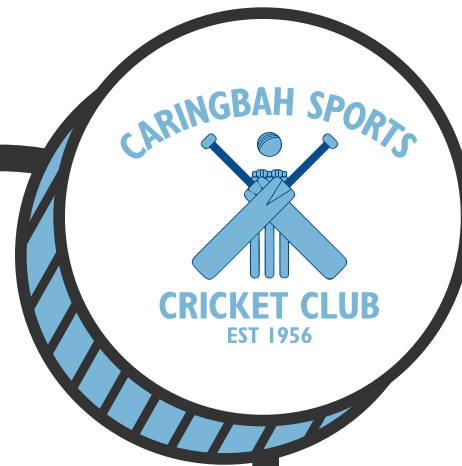

THE ENTHUSIASM AND POSITIVE ENERGY EACH PLAYER BROUGHT TO TRAINING AND THE GAMES EVERY WEEK MADE THE COACHES TASK A RELATIVELY EASY ONE. THE IMPROVEMENT IN ALL FACETS OF THE GAME FROM EVERY SINGLE PLAYER WAS AMAZING TO SEE, AND TO CAP IT ALL OFF THE BOYS ROSE TO THE OCCASION AND WON THE COMPETITION TOO! AMAZING YEAR ALL ROUND AND A JOY TO BE A PART OF SUCH A GREAT BUNCH OF BOYS.

He also chipped in with some solid stints behind the stumps.

**JAVIER GOODWIN:** Probably the biggest improver out of all the boys this year, Javier started the year with a raw set of skills and turned up each and every week to develop them into a competent cricketer. His bowling improved out of sight by the end of the season, with his accuracy the key aspect to this highlighted by his 1 for 2 off 2 overs in the Grand Final. His batting and running between wickets improved steadily over the course of the season as well, and with the extra training he is putting in, I can see a big year lined up next season.

**JAXON HASSAN:** Jaxon is a genuine athlete and that was on display with his all-round ability with the bat, ball and in the field. Whether it was opening the batting or in the middle order, Jaxon played some crucial innings to help get the team through some sticky situations, including 2 key knocks in both finals game. With the ball he was always reliable with his accurate left arm mediums and was very effective in tying opposition batsmen down. In the field Jaxon was never far from the action with his energy and quick movements leading to several direct hit run outs to go along with 8 catches.

**LACHLAN PODESTA:** Lachy was a quiet achiever, steadily improving as the year went on, and developing a real power game with the bat highlighted by a crucial 17 not out in the semi-final against IMCC. With a very natural action Lachy's bowling came a long way as well, bowling some very handy overs of medium pace at the back end of the season. 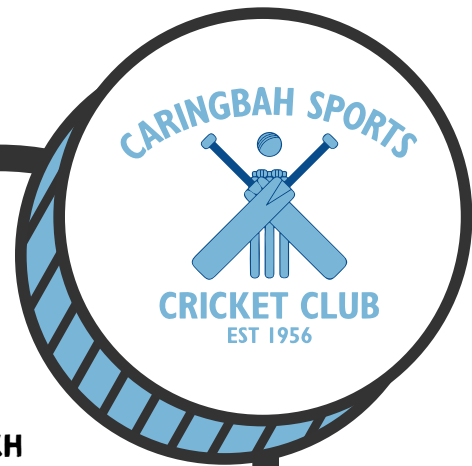

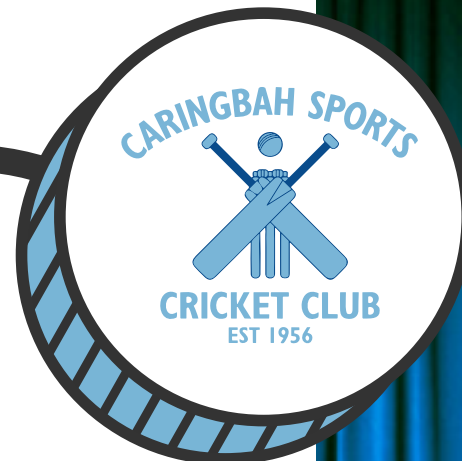

A big thank you to the parents that helped throughout the year, Stuart Langley in particular for managing the team and helping co-ordinate gear collections and scoring rosters amongst other thankless jobs, Simon Davies and Liam Merrick for stepping in when I was away but a thank you must go to all parents who helped throughout the year, whether it was at training or throwing balls to the boys on game day it is much appreciated. I must also say the boys were a pleasure to coach this year, they all got along very well with each other and their on-field behaviour and interactions with other teams and coaches were exemplary.

**REHAN ALI:** Rehan's progression throughout the year was immense, he played a vital role in our bowling attack bowling mostly fast and full picking up 10 wickets @ 17 and he scored vital runs for us in the lower order particularly latter in the season when he and Lincoln combined to win the game against Bangor 3 with 9 runs needed in the last over. Rehan also had the second highest score in the semi-final (16\*) which gave us a winning hope before we ran out of overs.

**XAVIER BEATTIE:** Xavier's leg spinners were a real handful for opposition batters in the early to middle overs, he bowled particularly well against Gymea 2 when we had the match figurers of 3/8 off 3 overs which included two stumpings. **NOAH DAVIES:** Noah often took the new ball for us and was one our most accurate bowlers, this season's bowling statistics don't do him justice which can sometimes happen when you're only bowling 3-4 overs a game but if he sticks with being patient the rewards will most certainly come. An accomplished batter with a good eye and an attacking streak, with a little practice he can undoubtedly turn into a very valuable allrounder. Noah was also very valuable in the deep, covering plenty of ground with tidy out fielding.

**JACK FLEMING:** Jack's batting tempo throughout the year often changed the momentum of the game, striking at 83 he was not one to usually get bogged down with scoring but with some better shot selection he can turn those 20's & 30's into 50+ game winning totals. Jack used the advantage of his height at times bowling some fast and accurate spells, with consistent practice he could certainly make this a strong

asset next to his improving batting.

With some targeted practice on hitting through the line of the ball he can further improve this aspect of his game.

**LINCOLN JONES:** Linc was clearly the best keeper in our competition and certainly saved us many runs with his tidy glove work, he is unrivalled with his passion for the game and is quickly learning and understanding field placements and bowling tactics. Linc's batting has come a long way over the past few seasons, scoring confidently square of the wicket and through cover he scored two valuable 50's with one being a match winning innings against Bangor 2 where he batted through the innings.

**THOMAS LANGLEY:** Tom can be proud of his first year in the U14's, he finished as our top run scorer with a highest score of 72\* off 71 balls against Bangor 2 and a great all-round performance against Bangor 1 in round 4 where he scored 49\* & took 3 wickets. Tom was also the equal second highest wicket taker taking important wickets when they mattered. Tom's cricket knowledge has grown considerably over the last few years, and it was great to see him put in valuable team performances with both bat and ball.

**PATRICK MCKIMM:** With Patty unfortunately having private school commitments we couldn't have him around as much as we'd like to, but he was a very valuable member of the team that brought a good sense of humour and some very "difficult to play" leg spinners that came from a height. Patty bowled superbly against Como 3 at Casuarina Road where he finished with 3/5 off 3 overs and totally changed the momentum of the game in our favour. I've got no doubt

with a bit of "cross bat" practice Patty can also enjoy some further success with the bat in hand.

**JAMES MERRICK:** James showed great resilience with the bat this season, remaining not out three times from nine innings, looking the most comfortable when he battered three against Bangor 2 where he compiled a classy 12. A handy medium pacer, his accuracy and consistency with the ball were key assets to the team. James also showcased very safe hands in the field and a number of times but his hands in the way of very firmly struck shots which he ultimately caught or saved a certain 4.

**KRIS PATEL:** Naturally a firm striker of the ball, Kris scored his runs quickly and powerfully. Kris played a great innings opening the batting against Como 3 where he scored 80\* off 95 balls after we were in trouble at 4/5. In this innings he combined for a 120 run partnership with Cameron Reed which is very rare for a 30 over match. Kris' bowling stats don't tell the full story as he is a very capable swing bowler who can generate good speeds when he's in a good rhythm, a little bit of work on his run up should do the trick. Fielding wise, it comes as no surprise that Kris tied with Lincoln (on 8) for the teams most catches.

**CAMERON REED:** Often winning the teams "one percent award" Cam throws himself into everything he does. He competes in all facets of the game and is hungry to win each contest. Cam's overall game has improved out of sight which reflected in him leading the wicket tally on 14 along with the lowest bowling economy of 2.47 runs per over. He also finished second in the batting aggregate with two important 50's against Como 3 with one of those being involved in the infamous 120 run partnership with Kris Patel.

**SHANNON WARD:** Shannon scored the third highest score of the year against Illawong, where he smashed an impressive 66 runs. This innings showcased his ability to construct a well balanced knock by setting a platform in the early stages and combining it with powerful hitting particularly on the legside. Shannon also made strong progress with his bowling with a change of grip mid-season getting the ball to swing into the right hander which proved to be a challenging assignment for many batters.

# 16A COACHES REPORT

THE 2024-25 SEASON BEGAN IN SPECTACULAR FASHION WITH LIAM TABONE AND OLIVER SAUNDERS TAKING FOUR WICKETS IN THE FIRST 4 OVERS OF THE MATCH TO HAVE GYMEA STRUGGLING AT 4-9. SADLY, IT WASN'T LONG AFTER THIS MATCH THAT LIAM SUFFERED A SIGNIFICANT BACK INJURY WHICH SAW HIM MISS MOST OF THE SEASON. OVER THE COURSE OF THE SEASON THE TEAM HAD MORE THAN THEIR FAIR SHARE OF INJURY CHALLENGES. AT ONE POINT WE HAD FIVE PLAYERS ON BOWLING RESTRICTIONS, A COUPLE OF BROKEN FINGERS, AND SOME PLAYERS UNAVAILABLE DUE TO VARIOUS OTHER FAMILY MATTERS. DESPITE THE CHALLENGES THE BOYS TURNED UP FOR EACH OTHER EACH WEEK AND WERE COMPETITIVE IN ALMOST EVERY GAME THEY PLAYED IN. THE TEAM FELL 2 GAMES SHORT OF PLAYING FINALS CRICKET AND HAD A COUPLE OF THE CLOSE RESULTS GONE A DIFFERENT WAY, THE BOYS WOULD HAVE ENDED UP PLAYING IN THE FINALS. THERE WERE MANY HIGHLIGHTS THROUGHOUT THE COURSE OF THE SEASON SOME OF WHICH ARE OUTLINED BELOW. MOST IMPRESSIVE WAS THE WAY IN WHICH THE BOYS SUPPORTED AND ENCOURAGED EACH OTHER ACROSS ALL THE MATCHES.

**HUXLEY ANDERSON:** Huxley took over the opening bowling responsibilities following Liam's injury and proved to be one of our most attacking bowlers with the new ball. Huxley bowls an excellent line and length and moves the ball nicely off the seam managing to find the edge of the bat regularly. Huxley took one of the catches of the season against Miranda to dismiss one of the most dangerous batters in the competition. Huxley also saved his best batting performance for the final game where he showed great temperament to rotate the strike and score an impressive personal best of 35.

**ETHAN BALL:** Ethan was our captain and has had an outstanding season. Ethan finished the season, the leading run scorer across all teams in the competition with 702 runs at an average of 58.5. Ethan had a top score of 116 in Round 5 against Cronulla-Seagulls and managed to score half centuries against every other team in the competition. Ethan also finished the leading wicket taker for the team and equal third across the competition with 17 wickets at an average of 16.0. Ethan displayed great maturity as a captain, providing leadership to the team. Congratulations Ethan on an excellent season. All the best for the future in senior cricket.

**AARON BIRADAR:** Aaron's greatest quality is his resilience. Aaron battled with a couple of injuries throughout the season causing him to miss several matches but despite this, Aaron is a great team player. Always willing to do whatever was needed for the benefit of the team. This was Aaron's first year in the U16A's and I'm sure he will benefit from the season. Aaron is a very tidy leg-spin bowler and produced one of the best spells of the season for the team in round 11 against Bangor with figures of 1-14 off 10 overs helping the team secure one of their best wins of the season.

**ADAM DALLA-CAMINA:** Adam is one of the most versatile players in our team. He is one of three spin bowlers and was able to bat in various positions depending on the state of the game. Adam has a very good defensive technique when it comes to batting and as the season progressed, he featured in some very important batting partnerships. There were some tight LBW decisions that went against Adam during the season, and in cricket that happens, but to Adam's credit he always handled them well. Adam would also regularly chip in with valuable wickets with his leg spinners but perhaps his all-round ability was most evident in the field. Adam was our leading catcher for the season with 7 catches, has an excellent throwing arm and filled in as wicket keeper for a couple of matches.

**WILL DOLLMAN:** Will started the season as one of our top order batsmen and finished the season as one of our opening bowlers. This is testimony to how Will's bowling improved over the course of the season finishing as the team's second

highest wicket taker with 14 wickets at an average of 17.1. Will's offspinners proved to be the perfect foil to our pace bowlers with the new ball, regularly tying down one end and restricting the run flow. In Round 9 Will produced the team's best bowling figures 5-48 v Como-Jannali, the team who ultimately won the competition. Will was also one of our most reliable fielders finishing the season with 6 catches.

**BLAKE KLAASSEN:** Blake is one of the more relaxed players in the team. Nothing seems to phase Blake, he always appears calm. Blake is one of the more powerful hitters in our team and throughout the course of the season featured in some very crucial middle order partnerships which helped the side out of some difficult situations. Blake is another of our reliable fielders taking 5 catches during the season. Towards the back end of the season Blake took on greater responsibility with the ball and bowled some very helpful economical spells. This was Blake's last season in Junior Cricket. All the best Blake for the future in senior cricket.

**KIERAN PARSONAGE:** Kieran was our main wicketkeeper during the season and managed a total of 10 dismissals, including 6 stumpings, 3 catches and 1 runout. Kieran is one of only two left-hand batters in the team and added some helpful stability to the middle order throughout the course of the season. Kieran is one of three players in the team who finishes Junior Cricket this season. It has been encouraging to see Kieran develop with his keeping. All the best Kieran in senior cricket.

**LEWIS PRICE:** Lewis set the tone in the field in the opening match taking one of the sharpest catches in the gully region that I have seen in junior cricket. Throughout the season, Lewis continued the good form in the field regularly taking hold of chances when they came his way and rarely misfielding. Early in the season Lewis shifted from the middle order to the top of the order and developed into a very reliable number 3 batsman. When early wickets fell, Lewis didn't panic and worked hard to value his wicket. Against Bangor Lewis featured in a 96 run partnership with Ethan. At times during the season when we were really struggling with injuries, Lewis also chipped in with some handy wickets.

**OLIVER SAUNDERS:** Oli was another of our opening pace bowlers. Oli's best attribute is his consistency. Always working hard at bowling a good line and length. Rarely did Oli go for more than 4 runs an over and given that he was usually bowling to the best batters in the opposition and quite often also bowling towards the end of the innings when the batters are looking to score quick runs, it is to Oli's

credit that he was able to restrict the scoring. Along with others in the team, who took some great catches, Oli took a great catch midway through the season against Cronulla-Seagulls that helped to slow the scoring down.

**LIAM TABONE:** Liam began the season in spectacular fashion opening the bowling and taking a season best 4-15 off 6 overs including 3 wickets in his first three overs of the season. Sadly, due to injury, Liam missed a large part of the season. However, we are very thankful that Liam was able to resume playing cricket towards the last part of the season. He trained hard in the nets and proved to be one of the most selfless players in the team. Liam is one of the quickest players in the team and several times when the game was on the line, Liam selflessly pushed hard for the extra run which on occasions cost him his wicket. In the field, Liam showed the same effort, saving lots of runs for the team by putting in the extra effort to make sure the ball didn't get past him.

**PATRICK TAYLOR:** Pat was a late inclusion, joining the team in Round 4, after a run of injuries meant the team was significantly short of players and in danger of not being able to field a team. We are very thankful to Pat for his contributions to the team. It was not always easy for Pat to get to training or to games given where he had to travel from. Pat proved to be a reliable fielder and led the way in showing loyalty to his captain's decision making on the field. Although bowling wasn't Pat's preference, he had the amazing ability to chip in for a much-needed wicket on several occasions, helping the team to restrict the opposition total just as they looked like getting away.

**THOMAS WOOD:** Tom was only able to play four games over the course of the season. In the early part of the season Tom, was restricted in the amount of bowling he could do owing to having just returned from injury. The responsibilities of school cricket also meant that Tom was not able to play the majority of the season. Despite only playing a handful of matches, Tom still featured in a very exciting middle order partnership with Blake Klaassen to help steer the team to victory in Round 3 against Miranda.
